There was another Brother of Jacob Shambaugh whom I heard Aunt Jane speak of whom Aunt Jane said came to lowa in the Southern part of State. Aunt Jane spoke of him as Uncle Henry. The family name was spelled three ways, Schambaugh, Schambach and Shambaugh.
Granfather Isaac Shambaugh's parents wereFather - Christian, born 11/23/1794, died 12/23/1882, buried at Middleburg, Pa.
Mother - Mana, born 1/24/1797, died 10/2/1837, buried at Middleburg, Pa.

There are on record accounts of 2 arrivals of Shambaughs in the U.S.A., Aug. 19. 1729. The ship Mortonhouse arrived in Philadelphia from the palatinate via Rotter-dam. On this ship were four people named; Adam, Christoff, Anna Dorthy and Elizabeth, probably husbands and wives. On Sept. 9, 1749, the ship St. Andrew arrived in the U.S.A. from Hamburg, Germany listing one of its passengers as George Schambach, and the investigators believed these were cousins.

Minors were never listed on ship passenger lists. In provincial papers of the county of Buck, Philadelphia under date of Feb. 13, 1739 there was a George Schambach listed, owning 100 acres of land. On April 29, 1740 in Buck County a George Shambaugh is listed with 150 acres of land, and on Feb. 28, 1743 the same with 40 acres of land.

These land warrants of Quit rental were issued by heirs of William Penn, and only to those of legal age, therefore it would seem that this George Schambach, or Shambach would have had to have been born previous to 1718 which would have made him 10 or 11 if a passenger on the Mortenhouse.
