PHILIP SHAMBAUGH, ninth child of Wm and Eliza Shambaugh of Wyandot Co. Ohio was born March 14, 1865 on the old homestead in Salem Twp. five miles west of Upper Sandusky, O., followed the occupation of farming in his earlier years. He married Miss Hattie Leightey on Nov. 22, 1887, later they moved to Forest, O. where their children were born, namely - Alma E. who lived only a few days, Viva Faye, born Sept. 3, 1890, Guy Gilbert, born Jan 12, 1893 and Esther Odessa, born April 7, 1896

Later on they moved to Marion, O. where Mr. Shambaugh worked as a machinist at the Marion Steam Shovel Co.

Esther died of typhoid fever on Oct. 28, 1907 and about three weeks later Mrs Shambaugh died of typhoid fever on Nov. 23, 1907. Later on Philip married again to Caroline Harriett, who still lives in Marion.

Faye married Clark O. Bender on May 12, 1912, Clark held a position with the Uhler, Phillips Store in Maroon. They had two sons - Nohl Stewart, born Feb. 16, 1913, and Warren Clark, born Nov. 24, 1915. Several years later ¹⁹²⁸ Faye and Clark moved to Oakland, Calif. where Clark now holds the position of Credit Manager in the Capwell Store. Faye died there on April 27, 1940. Clark is now married to Florence Eastman. Nohl married Alice Nicoll on Sept. 2, 1937 and lives in San Francisco. His occupation is a printer. Warren married Lola Mae Barley, Aug. 8, 1937 and lives in Hollywood where he was a Y.M.C.A. Sec'y until recently, but is now in Photography work. They have two children - Richard Warren, born Aug. 31, 1939 and Joanne Lee born June 6, 1944.

Guy married Miss Imo Fate, Aug. 16, 1920, is now manager of the Baber Bakery in Marion, O. Imo died June 25, 1949.

Death has struck at our band -- today I received a letter and clipping from Mrs Lucian Snyder of 911 Leland Ave. South Bend, Ind., replying to my Christmas card and letter. Lucian W. Snyder passed away June 2, 1949, after a lingering illness of several years. In fact he retired 20 years ago from the Post Office where he had previously worked for 34 years. We called on them once and took their pictures which appear in the Bucks Co. books. He was intensely interested in the family history and we corresponded several years till he had given me all he could get. When he could no longer answer, I was forced to spend my time getting help where I could. It was my Christmas card and letter that reminded Mrs Snyder I was still interested in them and she lost no time in giving the details. Lucian was highly respected by all who knew him, and he had many Indiana relatives. It was Mary Ann Shambach who founded this clan, she the fourth child of Christian, when she married Aaron Reuben Snyder in 1840. All her six children were born in Pa. before moving to Indiana in 1865. In fact her two oldest daughters were already married before that date, the Stolls not moving till 1867. Amelia Haines moving with her parents. It has produced a virile line in Indiana, second only to Jesse Shambach line of Pa. in size. Want to remind readers that Ellamanda Beeber who died in 1941 at 88 was the youngest child of Mary Ann Snyder, an aunt of Lucian's. I trust Mr Snyder understood how I have to drop contact with many as this TREE business has grown beyond bounds and has become a physical impossibility to correspond with all. Am sure Mrs Snyder has the sympathy of all Shambaughs. They were married 7/10/1895. Lucian was born

2/12/1875 so his death came at 74. In addition to his wife he is survived by their son, Robert M. Sr., three grandchildren, the oldest of whom, Robert M. Jr. is married and his baby was born June 15, 1949, - a 9th. generation baby named Robert Willard Snyder; also his sister, Mrs Carroll N. Pollock of South Bend.
