MOTHER OF BERT SHAMBAUGH IS CALLED..... The following account of the death of Mrs. Benjamin Shambaugh as from a Richland Center newspaper, " Funeral services were held in the city Saturday for Flayvilla Knowles Shambaugh, widow of Benjamin Shambaugh, who died January 21 at the home of her daughter Mrs Clarence Bell of Milwaukee, -burial was in Pine River cemetery. Born in Sauk County, Dec. 18, 1854, Mrs Shambaugh was 87 years old at the time of her death. With her marriage 67 years ago to Benjamin Lafayette Shambaugh she moved to Richland County and for many years her home was on a farm $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles south of the city. For several years she lived in Richland Center but for the past ten years she has lived in Milwaukee with her daughter. Her husband passed away April 27, 1932. Surviving the parents are two sons, Bert of Richland Center and Harry of Milwaukee, a daughter Mrs Ida Bell, two grandchildren and four great grandchildren. Imp.

SHILOH SIDNEY SHAMBAUGH..... C D Shambaugh of Jacksonville, Fla gives us the following account of the passing more than a year ago of his fellow townsman, the information coming from a Kokomo, Indiana newspaper, Shiloh Sidney Shambaugh was born June 6, 1869 at Avilla in Noble Co. Indiana and grew to manhood in that part of the state. On finishing his schooling he entered the employ of the Pennsylvania Railroad, eventually becoming agent at Ridgeville in Randolph County. From that position he came to Kokomo in 1900 to take charge of the transportation branch of the Kokomo Steel & Wire Co. In 1930, some time after this company had been merged with two other concerns, Mr. Shambaugh withdrew and for the next two years managed a small steel industry at Knightstown, Indiana. Later he went to Florida where he had citrus fruit interests. On June 1, 1934 he resumed contact with the steel interests and acted as a representative of the Continental Steel Corporation in Florida to the time of his death, having been in active duty when his fatal illness came on. He was survived by his widow, Mrs Alice Shambaugh, whose address is Walnut Manor Apts, Kokomo-- a son, Shiloh Sidney Jr who was with him at the time of his death and another son, Dr Noel Shambaugh of Long Beach, Calif. Mr. Shambaugh was twice married. His first wife died about 25 years ago in Kokomo. She and a daughter, remembered as Miss Fern Shambaugh are buried in the family plot which Mr. Shambaugh provided in Crown Point Cemetery.

BROTHER FOR BROTHER..... A Civil War episode told us by Chas S Bohart of Chicago, " John Shambaugh of Elvira, Clinton County, Iowa had a younger brother, Jacob and they lived on farms near each other in the same county. When the Civil War broke out John intended going but Jacob volunteered to take his place, leaving his wife and two-year old daughter, Mary, with his brother. Jacob Shambaugh lost his life in action Sept. 19, 1862 and his wife died soon leaving Mary Shambaugh to the care of her Uncle John who became her guardian. About 1885 Mary Shambaugh married Cephas Beard, a Lutheran minister. The union was childless and at her passing she, with many others of the Shambaughs was buried in Springvale cemetery near Clinton, while many others of the southeastern Iowa Shambaughs are buried in a large Shambaugh lot at Elvira."
