Services were conducted at the Schaffner - Denzer Funeral Home by the pastor Rev Ray C Dotson. Burial in the Marion Cemetery.

The body of the attractive divorcee, Mrs Susan Hansen, 24, was found fatally beaten early Monday May 25, 1959 in her Chicago South Side home. Police say she died of a broken neck. Her ex-husband, Duncan Hansen, has been questioned by police.

She leaves three children, Nancy 6, Charles 3 and Laura 2. Mrs Hansen was the daughter of Dr. George M. Shambaugh Jr., member of a family long prominent in medical circles, and Mrs Albert Long, wife of a University of Chicago Professor.
